The Curriculum in Mobility Studies provides 120 CFUs over two years.

Students are advised to take approximately **30 CFU each semester**, i.e. to attend no more than 5 courses per semester in the first year, and do the internship and the remaining exams in the second year.

For reasons related to VISA, scholarships, etc., international students are generally advised to plan their international mobility (Erasmus+ for studies, Erasmus+ for traineeship) in the second semester of the second year, before graduation.

USEFUL INFORMATION - Study Plan

A study plan is a detailed overview of activities to be completed to achieve your degree. We recommend filling in the study plan as soon as it becomes available, starting at the end of November, in order to be able to register for exams when the time comes. The study plan can be modified as many times as needed until you register for graduation. It can then be modified as many times as you need until you register for graduation.
