

The Internet

- INTERconnected NETwork
- The Internet is a giant network of networks




- A network may include PCs, servers, printers and many other devices
- A network is connected through a communication channel





World Wide Web – WWW

- The World Wide Web (WWW or Web) is often confused with the Internet
- The Web did not exist until the 1980's
- In 1989 Tim Berners-Lee created a set of technologies that allowed information on the Internet to be linked together through the use of hyperlinks, or connections in documents

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
- The Web was mostly text based until the emergence of web browsers

- These applications are accredited with popularising the WWW





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

Internet Users in the World by Geographic Regions - 2015 Q2





 - have different goals and are trying to complete different tasks
















How to Model the User

- Implicit Modelling
 - Inferring information about users based on their actions

Homo floresiensis ("Flores Man": nicknamed "hobbit" and "Flo") is widely believed to be an extinct species in the genus Homo. The remains of an individual that would have stood about 3.5 feet (1.1 m) in height were discovered in 2003 on the island of Flores in Indonesia. Partial skeletons of nine individuals have been recovered, including one complete skull, referred to as "LB1".[1][2] These remains have been the subject of intense research to determine whether they represent a species distinct from modern humans. This hominin is remarkable for its small body and brain and for its survival until relatively recent times (possibly as recently as 12,000 years ago).^[3] Recovered alongside the skeletal remains were stone tools from archaeological horizons ranging from 94,000 to 13,000 years ago. Some scholars suggest that the historical H. floresiensis may be connected by folk memory to ebu gogo myths prevalent on the isle of Flores.[4]

The discoverers (archaeologist Mike Morwood and colleagues) proposed that a variety of features, both primitive and derived, identify these individuals as belonging to a new species, H. floresiensis, within the taxonomic tribe of Hominini, which includes all species that are more closely related to humans than to chimpanzees.^{[1][3]} The discoverers also proposed that H. floresiensis lived

Recommender Systems

- Recommender Systems seek to predict how interesting, relevant or useful a user would find a piece of content
- For example:
 - Offering news articles to online readers, based on a prediction of reader interests
 - Offering customers of an online retailer suggestions about what they might like to buy, based on their past history of purchases and/or product searches.






Recommender Systems

- There are two main categories of recommender systems:
- Content-based systems
 - examine properties of the items recommended. For instance, if a Netflix user has watched many cowboy movies, then recommend a movie classified in the database as having the "cowboy" genre.
- Collaborative filtering systems
 - recommend items based on similarity measures between users and/ or items. The items recommended to a user are those preferred by similar users.

Personalised Search and Retrieval

- Information Retrieval systems help users to find information from the vast sea of content available on the Web.
 - i.e. Google
- Traditional IR systems give the same list of results for each query, regardless of the user.
- Personalised IR systems try to deliver search results that are not only of relevance to the query, but are also of particular relevance to the person who submitted the query.

- We want to deliver the benefits, without some of the limitations
- Compensation for the lack of Serendipity on the personalised web









Take a fictional Target shopper named Jenny, who is 23, lives in Atlanta and in March bought cocoa-butter lotion, a purse large enough to double as a diaper bag, zinc and magnesium supplements and a bright blue rug. There's an 87% chance that she's pregnant and that her delivery date is sometime in late August.
