The power of images

- It is difficult to remember abstract concepts
- If we speak by images it is easier for people to remember what we say

The power of anecdotes/personal stories

- Make speech more interesting, personal and involving → creates empathy
- The audience feels closer to the speaker
 - more likely to remember their presentation
