- Show interest

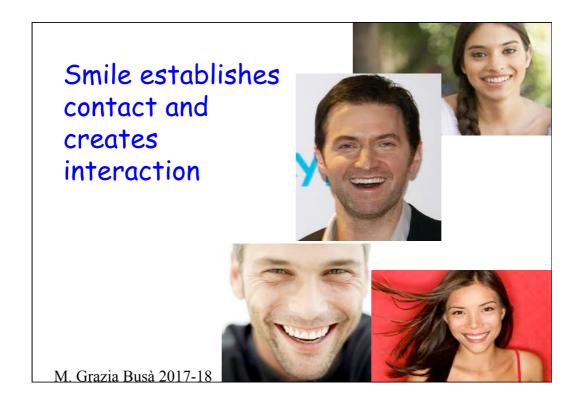

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#### Gaze

 Provides very powerful non-verbal signals, i.e.,

information on the actual

situation.









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#### Gaze functions

Direct gaze (eye contact)

- ◆ Reinforcement
  - **◆ Emphasis**
  - **◆ Intimacy**
- ◆ Approval, invitation
  - ◆ Threat

Indirect, avoiding gaze

- Anxiety
- ♦ Embarassment
- ◆ Insincerity
- ◆ Fear
- ♦ Submission

#### Gaze functions

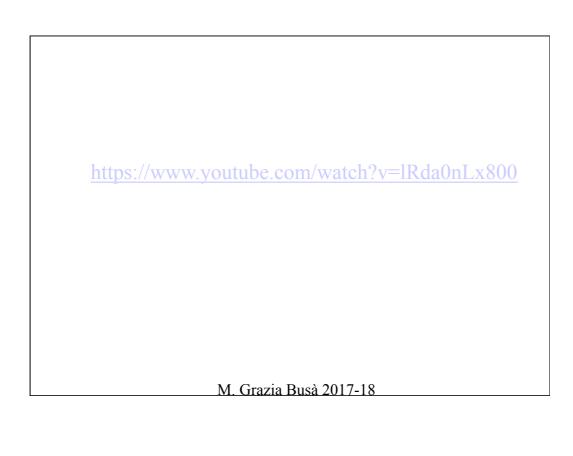
Indirect gaze (eye avoidance)

- Does not establish a relationship
  - ◆ Reveals lack of self esteem
    - ◆ Often reveals deceit

#### Staring

◆ Makes people feel unconfortable
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 Make solid eye contact, especially while YOU are speaking

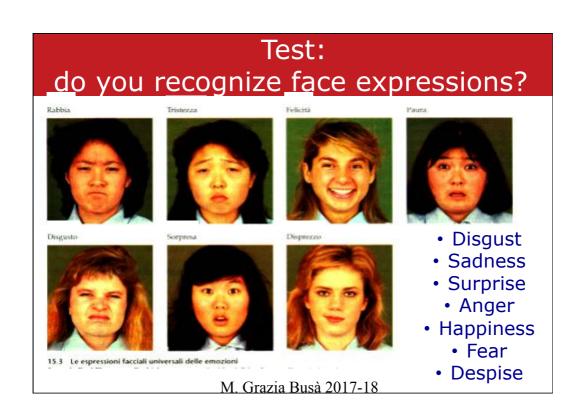


# The expressions on the face

### Your face

#### Projects:

- personality features
  - emotions
- (happiness, surprise, interest, fear, sadness, disgust, anger)
- interactivity reactions (to other people's communication or context)



 Your face portrays your bad feelings

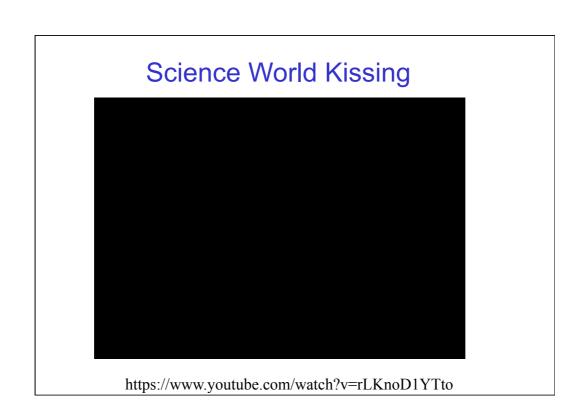

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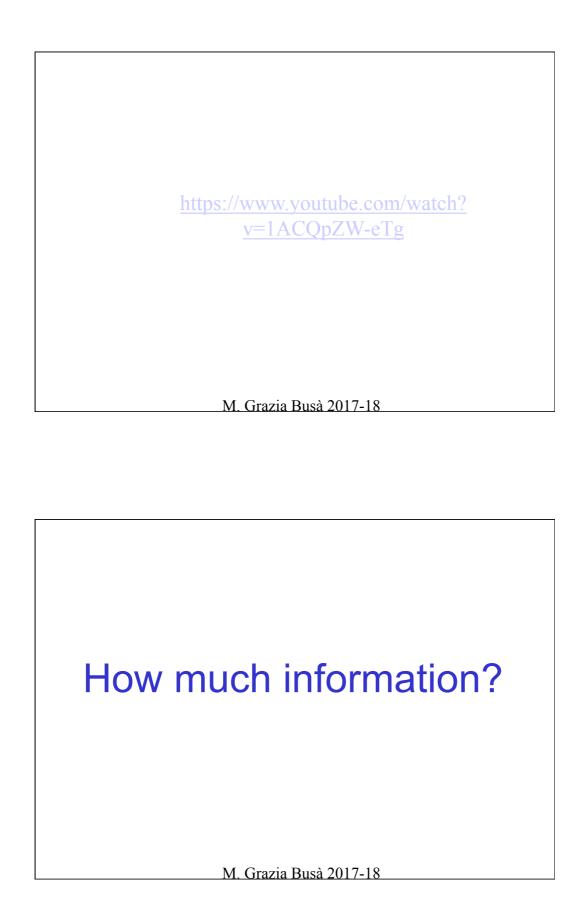

## Revealing yourself

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## Revealing yourself

- Show your true self
  - Weakenesses and vulnerability can be enadearing and wmpowering
- Makes you very personable
- You are the way you present yourself



#### How much information?

- Give only the info that is relevant to the situation
- Present yourself in an way that triggers interests

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### Don't speak too slow or too fast

- Speaking too slow makes you sound less truthful, less fluent, and less persuasive
- Lots of hesitations ('um' and 'ah') show that you don't what you're talking about.
- Speaking too fast show nervousness anf may be hard to understand
