

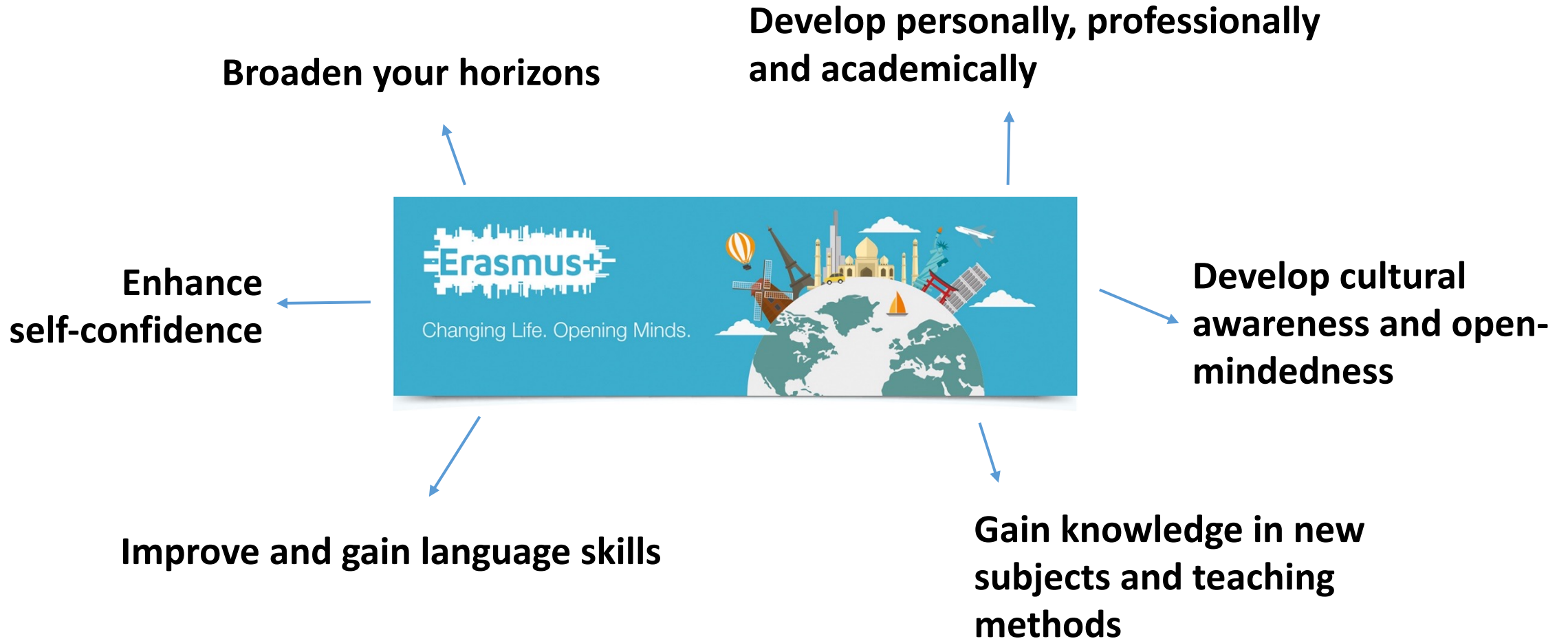

ERASMUS + STUDY

- 12 months abroad per study cycle (Traineeship programme included).
- 2 months minimum (max. depending on the agreement)
- The academic activities carried out abroad (exams, research activity for thesis, stage) will be fully recognized
- Grant (+ funding for travel expences, + additional funds on a meritocratic and income basis)
- All enrolled students can participate as far as they do not receive another European scholarship (extra EU Citizens will need a visa)

First call: November

Second call for vacant places: April (TBC)

ERASMUS + STUDY

Erasmus scholarships are not full grants, but simply a little financial help (€ 350/300/250 depending on the destination).

You will also receive:

- A funding for travel expenses according to the destination
- Additional funds on a meritocratic and income basis. Please remember to submit your ISEE/ISEU form.
- Extensions will not be covered by the scholarship.
- If this is not your first mobility, your scholarship will depend on the budget at our disposal.

CHOOSING YOUR DESTINATION WISELY:

- You can choose only among the Universities which have an **agreement** with our Department/School
- Pay attention to the **field of study** of the agreement
- You can only apply for Universities which accept Master students (**Study Cycle 2**)
- Please verify that you meet the **language requirements of the University**
- **Competition** is high, take it into consideration the course catalogues of smaller universities, too, and remember that Erasmus is a great experience even if spent in a small city.



- **HOW TO CHOOSE COURSE UNITS AS AN OUTGOING ERASMUS STUDENT**
- Local Development students generally spend their 2nd year abroad through an Erasmus exchange
- Students have to carefully plan a Learning Agreement that will substitute the 2nd year study plan they would have otherwise attended in Padua
- In case students want to attend a course unit planned for the 1st year, this shall be exactly matching with the one that would have been attended in Padua
- In case students want to attend abroad course units that differ significantly with the Local Development study plan, these will be marked as elective course units (for a maximum of 9 credits)
- Professors in charge of validating students' Learning Agreements and Transcripts of Record will carefully evaluate students' choices in order to grant consistency with the aims and scope of Local Development curriculum.

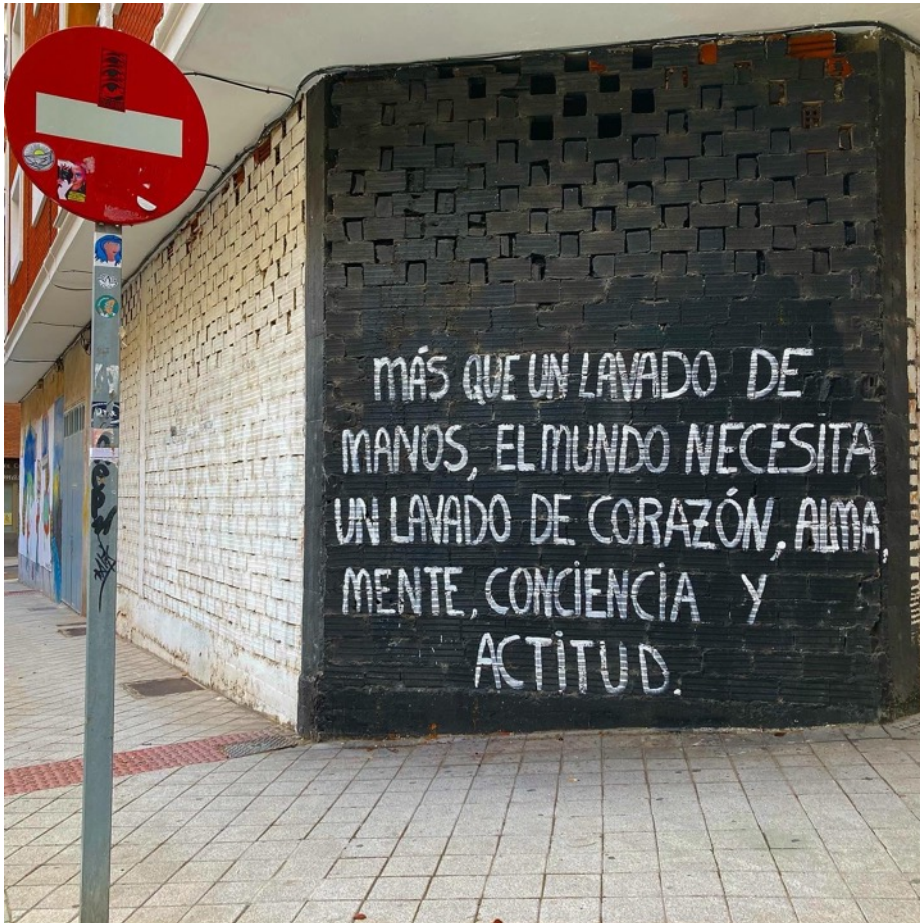
- **WHAT STUDENTS SAY**
