Nomination

Deadline:

Fall semester & full year: March 31 Spring semester: September 30

Students will receive an email with a link to the online application form after the nomination deadline and will have to apply before the application deadline. Students can expect their offer letters in July/August for September entry November/December for January entry

Application

Deadline:

Fall semester & full year: April 30 Spring semester: October 31

Once a student recieves a link, they can start the application process. Documents to submit:

- Passport (valid for the whole period of exchange)
- Most up-to-date official Transcript of Records (ToR) signed&stamped
- English Language Proficiency (ELP) certificate

Requirements

Students must have completed at least 2 semesters at the undergraduate level or equivalent before applying for their exchange programme at the UoB.

Academic requirement:

For partners outside of the EU, we have Country specific academic entry requirements that can be found <u>here</u>.

English Language Proficiency (ELP) requirements can be found here.

One-semester students coming from our European partners are only required to submit a confirmation by their home coordinator that they have B2 level of English. We strongly encourage you to use our template available on the <u>website</u>.

Modules

Exchange students must study 60 UoB credits (equivalent to 30 ECTS) per semester and 120 UoB credits (equivalent to 60 ECTS) per full academic year.

The University is structured around five Colleges, four of which are open to Study Abroad and Exchange students (College of Medical and Dental Sciences is currently excluded). Students need to select their host school and preferred college, which is relevant to their study plan. At least 40 credits per semester should be selected within the preferred College but can be in multiple Schools within that College.

The four Colleges that are open to Study Abroad and Exchange students are:

- College of Arts and Law
- College of Engineering and Physical Sciences
- College of Social Sciences
- College of Life and Environmental Sciences

We also have an independent school – Liberal Arts and Natural Sciences.

More information regarding modules can be found <u>here</u>. All modules are subject to availability and academic pre-requisites. Please also note that modules offered in 2024/25 will be updated with new handbooks before the summer break.

Exams

Examination dates at the UoB are different in each College and depend on the modules students choose. The assessment periods take place in January and June for full year students.

Alternative assessments will be arranged for students who attend the first semester only. Second semester only students must complete their assessments in June.

Transcript of Records

The University has moved to a secure online system called 'VERIFY'. This online platform is for students to share their academic results with their home university. Please find the Verify website here and note that home universities will not be sent hard copy of transcripts, coordinators can view and download an electronic copy of each student's official transcript from Verify after a student gives them access to their record.

Students will receive one hard copy of their transcript that will be sent directly to their home address upon completion of their studies in Birmingham.



Living expenses

The cost of living in Birmingham is low when compared to some other major cities like London and Edinburgh. It will depend on a number of factors such as the type of accommodation, the amount spent on food, travel, clothing, and social activities. You can find more information here.

Housing

For Study Abroad and Exchange students from outside of Europe, the University is able to guarantee on-campus housing. Although the university accommodation is not guaranteed for students from EU partners, we still encourage them to apply as early as possible. Our Accommodation team will help them find a room with one of our partner providers in cases where it is not possible to secure an on-campus accommodation.

Health & Insurance

We recommend that you purchase a health insurance before you travel and arrive in the UK. The University has a health centre on campus and you should register with this service when you arrive.

If you will be in the UK for more than six months, you will be able to use the National Health Service in the same way as anyone permanently resident in the UK. However, pre-existing medical conditions requiring long-term medication or hospital treatment may not be covered. Repatriation would also not be covered, therefore we recommend to get a health insurance before you arrive.

If your course lasts six months or less, you will be treated as a private patient and will have to pay to see adoctor. The charges for this can be especially high if you need medication or hospital treatment. Dental and optical treatment must also be paid for, as is the case for those permanently resident.

Visas

All students coming for one semester are sent a standard visitor visa letter (issued by UoB after you accept your offer). All students coming for the full year must get a student visa that also requires you to get a CAS number (issued by UoB after you accept your offer).
