For WSA programmes, module and duration restrictions apply. Students cannot take any elective modules outside the subject they have been nominated for. Workload Requirements

Workload per semester

30 ECTS or 60 CATS (Southampton credits). Modules are typically worth 7.5 ECTS each.

Contact hours per module

Admission Requirements



English Language Requirements

All single-semester exchange students (from partner universities) must submit an English Language Proficiency Letter. Each student must provide one letter, completed and signed by their home institution's representatives to confirm that the student has a minimum English Language proficiency equivalent to B2 in all four areas.

All other students (full-year exchange students and fee-paying single semester or full-year students) must meet our entry requirements and submit their IELTS/TOEFL or Duolingo certificate dated within 2 years of the start of the term they are applying for.

Requirements: Minimum IELTS overall score of 6.5 with no less than 6.0 in all components or an equivalent standard in other qualifications. Some courses may require a higher score. Please contact us if uncertain.

Academic Requirements

All students must have a GPA of minimum 3 on a 4-point scale or equivalent standard.

Tuition Fees



Exchange students do not need to pay tuition fees.

If you do not receive this link and you would like to nominate students, please get in touch with us before the deadline.

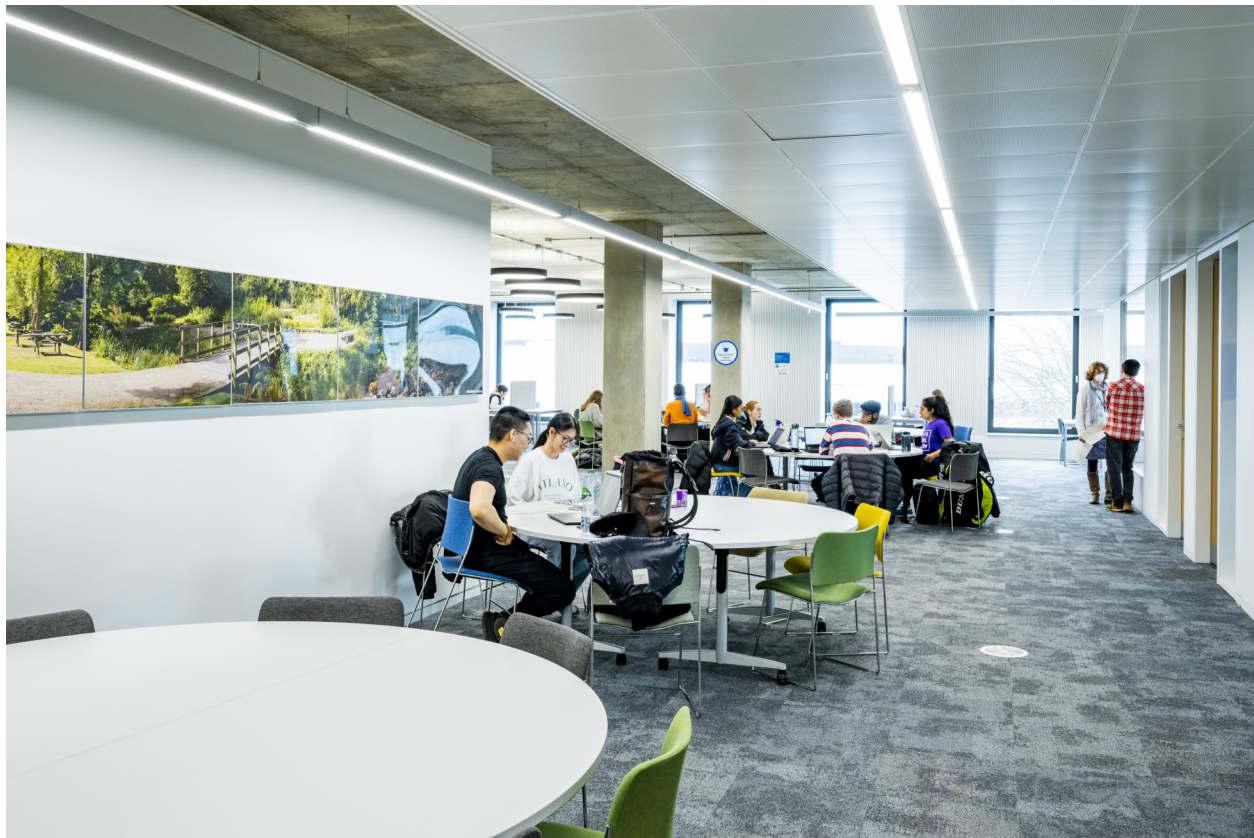

Transcripts

Transcripts will be available to order at the end of each semester, after marks are released. Students are solely responsible for obtaining the transcript through the official ordering process outlined on [this page](#). Students can order a digital and/or hard copy of their transcript after the following dates:

Semester 1 – 20th February 2025

Semester 2 – 26th June 2025

The exact dates for the following academic year are published every September and may change by a day or two.

When a student orders their transcript via the online store, they can add their home university as a recipient for their transcript. The University of Southampton certificates team will then send the transcript to the student and their home university nominator. It is the responsibility of the student to ensure they add home university contacts as recipients when ordering a transcript. As of August 2025, transcripts can take up to 30 working days to be delivered.

University Accommodation



A range of accommodation options are available at a variety of price points and locations close to each of our campuses. Our rooms are all single-occupancy and can be private en-suite rooms or shared bathroom rooms. Students can submit special requests, such as accessibility features, a quieter room, a single-gender or alcohol-free flat, and more.

An offer of accommodation is guaranteed for students coming to Southampton for a single semester only, provided they apply by the deadline.
